 - Broadcom Direct
- **Corporate:** Next 1,500
 - Push to VCF Multi-Year
 - Channel Partner
- **Commercial:** The Rest
 - Push to Multi-Year
 - Wider SKU Options

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VMware Negotiations: Working from a position of limited leverage

Negotiation Tactics:

- Discount Drivers
 - Product
 - Multi-year (3 or 5 year)
 - Core Count
- Benchmarks
- Demeanor
- Escalation
- Uplifts
 - 7% per year with notice
 - No protection
- Term for Convenience Clause

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Broadcom's Bullying Tactics

- Forcing multi-year deals on customers
- Terminated legacy license downloads effective April 2024
- Pricing under the new model is 2x to 12x legacy SnS costs annually
 - Clustered around 2-4x
- Force minimum volume commitments despite optimized core counts
- Leveraging audits upon ELA expirations or non-transition of SnS to new SKUs
- Not honoring "outyear clauses" for ELA agreements
- Delayed renewal quotes – 90 days prior to renewal date earliest

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Broadcom's Bullying Tactics Continued

- Limited zero-day security patches (CVSS 9.0 or higher for vSphere 7.x and 8.x only)
- Specific Program Documentation (SPD) – changes monthly for most products
 - Recent changes:
 - 1) 16 core to 8 core min for VCF-E + Max 10 locations down from 28
 - 2) vSAN TIB capacity increased from 100GiB to 250 GiB/core for VVF
- Reinstatement Fees for late renewals

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VMware Audit "Gotchas"

- Over Deployments
- Territory Restrictions (Regional entitlement vs Global)
- License Key Management
- Changes with Broadcom Acquisition – license keys did not transfer in a clean manner; old keys retired + all legacy key history
- Hosting Restrictions – internal business use vs external applications




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Best Practices for Staying Compliance

- **Acknowledge Price Changes:** VMware is no longer a low-cost solution. Treat it like a premium product.
- **License Checkups:** Conduct an ELP review; consider a third party service for data collection and auditor interpretation and remediation.
- **Optimize Deployments:** Reduce excess deployments and rightsize the subscription footprint – flex down.
- **Foster Compliance Awareness** – Build a license culture focused on consumption needs under the new subscription model.
- **Evaluate Alternatives** – Build out a “what if” scenario to show back TCO costs to the business.




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Broadcom Audit Process

- **Notification:** You'll receive an audit notification letter.
- **Aggressive Approach:** Broadcom auditors are known for being assertive and strict.
- **Third-Party Auditors:** Currently VMware/Broadcom is conducting audits directly
- **Sales Involvement:** Once the audit is done, Broadcom's sales team steps in to discuss compliance issues and potential penalties.
- **Back Penalties:** Broadcom typically imposes penalties for up to two years of non-compliance.




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
